Staying safe at services COVID-19

It is no longer a legal requirement to keep most of the rules regarding social distancing. A loop system may be provided in this church. Please ask or check by switching your hearing aid to the "T" position.

**Readings: Old Testament Reading:
Ruth 2.2-3 NIV**

And Ruth the Moabite said to Naomi,
“Let me go to the fields and pick up the leftover grain behind anyone
in whose eyes I find favour.”

Naomi said to her, “Go ahead, my daughter.” So she went out,
entered a field and began to glean behind the harvesters.

As it turned out, she was working in a field belonging to Boaz, who
was from the clan of Elimelek.

Boaz replied,
“I’ve been told all about what you have done for your mother-in-
law since the death of your husband—how you left your father and
mother and your homeland and came to live with a people you did
not know before. May the LORD repay you for what you have done.
May you be richly rewarded by the LORD, the God of Israel, under
whose wings you have come to take refuge.”

“May I continue to find favour in your eyes, my lord,” she said. “You
have put me at ease by speaking kindly to your servant—though I do
not have the standing of one of your servants.”

At mealtime Boaz said to her, “Come over here. Have some
bread and dip it in the wine vinegar.”

When she sat down with the harvesters, he offered her some roasted
grain. She ate all she wanted and had some left over. As she got up
to glean, Boaz gave orders to his men, “Let her gather among the
sheaves and don’t reprimand her. Even pull out some stalks for her
from the bundles and leave them for her to pick up, and don’t
rebuke her.”
